WHY DO DOGS LIKE TO STICK THEIR HEADS OUT CAR WINDOWS

Dogs seem to stick their heads out of moving cars almost any chance they get. What's so great about a wind-whipped snout?

While there are competing studies observing different aspects of why dogs stick their heads out of moving car windows, they all agree on the fact that this is a uniform behavior, and one that's linked, consciously or not, to various forms of position reinforcements. There's the idea that dogs, with their acute senses of smell, take in vigorous whips of information via their window excursions; for them, the moments in which they're sticking their noses into a slew of new and exciting smells are intoxicating. The window's main draw isn't the scenery or the breeze, it's the smell! As air moves over the olfactory membrane, odor molecules settle on the scent receptors and get recognized. The more air there is flowing over the membrane, the more scents the dogs can detect. So when a dog sticks its head out the window, it's like pigging out at a hi-definition all-you-can-smell scent buffet.

HEADS OUT THE WINDOW

However, there are other studies which pay less attention to the possible pleasurable reasoning behind dog behavior, and instead focus more on the role of social training. Perhaps dogs, when they're in cars, are participating in their own forms of pack behaviors; after all, humans also love to stick their heads and limbs out of car windows, so it seems natural that dogs might mimic their owners' behaviors. There's also the fact that for most dogs, being driven in a car might be a rare-ish occasion, one that they mark in their own particular way, e.g. sticking their head out of the window.

Most likely, the "true" reasoning behind dogs' behaviors with windows is a combination of all of those things, or perhaps we humans are just overthinking the intent behind the motion. Sometimes, all you want out of a window breeze is the breeze itself; it isn't a reflection of some other instinct, or some other want. But considering the important role that canines play in human society, it's not surprising that we want to peer closer into their brains and try to understand them better, on *our* own terms. Yet in the end, dogs are just as predictable, and yet unique as people are. And sometimes, they might just want to feel the wind whip past them on a hot day, on a cool night, as the sights stream past at a cinematic clip.

They like taking in as much of the world as possible, and associate those experiences as positive.

Unfortunately, they are oblivious to the dangers of their precarious perch. Few people would even think of allowing their children to hang heads out of a car window, or to stick their heads out of a sun roof, but they still allow their pets to risk serious injury by doing so.

Dogs love the wind in their face, but bad things can happen. First, foreign objects like leaves, insects and rocks can strike them with tremendous velocity. Just think back to the damage a tiny pebble might have done to your windshield or the finish of your car. The cornea of a dog's eye is far more delicate, and damages are not so easily repaired. Similarly, foreign bodies can find their way into a dog's ear or nose and cause severe inflammation.

Were doggie goggles, be sensitive to your speed, and it's a treat not a full time experience


