



HISTORY OF IRISH SETTERS

Originating in Ireland, the Irish Setter first developed around the 18th Century. At first they were called Red Spaniels. The Irish Setter has been described by its partisans as the most beautiful of dog breeds. The Irish Setter's lovable personality has endeared the breed to sportsmen and pet owners for more than 200 years. Irish are outgoing dogs who enjoy making friends. These rambunctious redheads are big kids at heart, but they are eager to please and will respond to patient, positive training. They are said to be bold and rugged hunting partners, with a devil-may-care approach to their work.

In 1875, an Irish Setter name Elcho, came to the United States. He quickly became a star in the show ring and the field. In 1878, Elcho was the first Irish Setter to be registered by the American Kennel Club.

Once Irish Setters came to America, they quickly became one of the most popular breed of dogs. They are known as the original breed for the magazine *Field and Stream*.

President Nixon had an Irish Setter named King Timahoe.

Today the Irish Setter ranks as 68th among the 155 breeds recognized by the AKC.
